

Finance Act, 1901. from which they state it will be observed this sanction is not required to any payments made thereunder. They point out that they consider the contractor for sugar is only entitled to the extra duty which he can prove he paid on the sugar supplied to the Workhouse since 22nd Sept last. They point out that the Increase in duty at 22nd Sept 1915 was $\frac{7}{6}$ per Cwt. The full amount of this was not immediately effective as the price fixed by the Sugar Commission practically reduced it to about $\frac{4}{9}$. On 2nd January last the effective duty became $\frac{7}{3}$ and early in March to the full amount viz $\frac{7}{6}$.

Mr George Whyte contractor for supply of sugar wrote, date 5th inst. stating that any sugar supplied to him from that date will be subject to $\frac{7}{6}$ per lb additional duty, put on by the Government on 4th inst.

He points out that his tender in Sept last for ~~that his tender~~ ^{Sugar} was at 3³/₄d per lb. together with any additional duty that might be put on and in no way subject to market fluctuations: whether Sugar Commission raised or lowered price
