Dear Mr. Doherty:

After consideration at the White House, your telegram of May 2, 1960, to President Eisenhower, has been sent to the Department of State for reply. You expressed your views concerning Ireland.

The Department has long been aware of the questions arising from the partition of Ireland. We believe, however, that this is a matter for determination by the United Kingdom and the Republic of Ireland, both of whom are friendly to the United States, and is not, therefore, one in which we can properly or usefully intervene.
