REMEMBERING OUR PAST SHARING OUR FUTURE

As custodians of the collective memory of a county, the Library Service's role is to make available the literature and recorded history, culture of an area. An area's identity emerges out of its collective memory.

With this in mind, Donegal County Council Library Service has developed a comprehensive reading list and collection of books on the theme of Ireland and Donegal in the revolutionary era, 1912-1923. This reading list includes a range of titles that explore key themes of our shared history in the early part of the 20th century.

The decade between 1912 and 1923 was one of the most momentous in Irish history and is being commemorated in various ways across Ireland over the coming years. The production of this reading list and the development of a lending collection allows the Library Service to play a positive and proactive role in the commemorative celebrations.

HANDS OF HISTORY ~ ONE DONEGAL. MANY PASTS, ONE FUTURE

The books and the reading list were funded by Donegal County Council's Hands of History ~ One Donegal, Many Pasts, One Future project.
